Colombia eliminates VAT for three days to reactivate its economy

The Colombian government arranged for June and July three days without VAT to reactivate its economy after the impact of the coronavirus. "It is the official



protocols in case the process can already be done physically."

The measure seeks to **reactivate domestic consumption** and was set for June 19, July 3, and July 19, covering products of **up to 2.8 million Colombian pesos** (US \$ 725.17).

Tax exemption and aid to small merchants

It applies to textile products, household appliances, sports equipment, computer and telephone equipment; supplies, agricultural supplies and small means of transport such as bicycles, including electric ones, the DPA news agency reported.

In addition, the Colombian government announced complementary measures, such as tax exemptions for restaurants and the rental of commercial premises, until July 31.

"These measures are not aimed at large supermarket chains, but at small premises, such as bakeries or coffee shops, which will be exempt from paying
