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U.S Midterms and the consequences for Global Trade

Dear Members of the Customs and Trade Community

This week saw the **midterm elections in the United States**. As in previous years, we can expect this to have an impact on global trade policy, potentially affecting many businesses. In this update I discusses **the implications for Europe and the United Kingdom**.

With the addition of **Tornado Cash to the SDN list**, we can see that **virtual currencies** based on Ethereum smart contracts are being used to **launder money** and send billions illegally. We investigate US policy toward virtual currency in the context of sanctions and export controls.

The amendments to the **EU Dual Use Regulations for 2023** are in the works. This update includes the preliminary version of the document as well as a draught non-binding overview of Annex I changes.

The United Kingdom published the **16th version of the Russia (Sanctions) (EU Exit) (Amendment) Regulations 2022.** We list the most important amendments.

The mandatory requirements for issuing **international invoices for customs and global trade** have been published in France. Our English synopsis is attached.

United States

We looked through the updates of the US Federal Register, CBP, BIS, OFAC and others. Here we present the latest news and important information, predominantly in the area of U.S. Export Controls and Sanctions.

U.S. Midterms & Free Trade

What can Europe's businesses expect for the next 2 years?

A commentary on Europe-UK-US trade ties after the US midterm elections.by Arne Mielken, Managing Director of Customs Manager Ltd.

The president of the United States is elected every four years. Nonetheless, the midterm elections occur two years after the presidential election. This indicates that the members of Congress and the Senate were recently elected. In the US midterm elections held in November 2022, by the time of writing this, it is possible that the Republican Party will gain control of the House of Representatives, possibly the Senate, too. This may have significant ramifications for future U.S. trade policies and might impact European companies' access to American markets.

Let's examine some recent events:

Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership: A Lost Opportunity (TTIP)

In 2014, after Barack Obama lost the election to a Republican majority, the EU-US Free Trade Agreement could not advance.

The purpose of the U.S.-EU free trade agreement was to reduce the cost of commerce between EU and U.S. companies, therefore strengthening the economies of both areas. EU and the United States had the largest bilateral trade relationship in the world at the time, accounting for about one-third of global trade. In 2017, the annual value of transatlantic commerce in goods and services was close to \$1 trillion.

Before the 2014 midterm elections, the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) made quick progress despite considerable obstacles. After the Republicans took control of the House, there was no longer the will to implement the agreement. Economic facilitation between Europe and the United States ceased to be a priority overnight. Since then, companies have had to bear ongoing customs fees and border friction. The project was abandoned and never restarted. The most crucial opportunity for transatlantic free trade - lost!

Northern Ireland Arrangements destroy the United Kingdom-United States Free Trade Agreement

In the United States, the 2018 midterm elections yielded a Democratic House majority. The thenpresident, a Brexit proponent, had promised the then-prime minister of the United Kingdom, Boris Johnson, a rapid and comprehensive trade agreement with the United States. However, the election of the Democrats precluded the signing of the US-UK Free Trade Agreement until the Northern Ireland problem was settled, which has never occurred to this day.

The EU and the United Kingdom have battled for years on how to handle Northern Ireland most effectively. The United Kingdom was dissatisfied with the legal agreement reached between the United Kingdom and the European Union and wanted a comprehensive renegotiation, which the EU rejected. As the United States is a guarantor of a fragile peace accord in Northern Ireland, the Democratic majority of the House of Representatives placed as a condition for a trade pact a stable EU-UK agreement that would guarantee Northern Ireland's peace. Due to the absence of a mutually acceptable EU-UK deal on Northern Ireland, there is now no trade agreement between the EU and the United States.

What is the future of Europe-U.S. relations? Relations commerciales après the midterm elections of 2022?

The Republican Party has always opposed trade facilitation for foreign market access to the United States. Republicans feel that other countries take advantage of the existing ease of entry to the American market. Republicans usually mention China as an example. They feel that the Chinese had significant access to U.S. technology, creativity, and know-how, which contributed to the country's rise. China is now viewed as a serious geopolitical competitor. According to the Republican viewpoint, free market policies have contributed to this growth. Therefore, they want less rather than more free trade.

Need greater evidence? In the recent past, during the far-right government of President Trump, relations between the EU and the US were so terrible that both sides placed 25% additional tariffs on the exports of the other. This impeded commerce between the European Union and the United States.

Conclusion

After the midterm elections, it is doubtful that the relationship between the European Union, the United Kingdom, and the United States would undergo substantial revisions or policies designed to facilitate trade for EU or UK businesses. Given growing inflation, the cost of living, the energy crisis, the conflict in Ukraine, internal and foreign terrorism, and dangers to American democracy itself, neither the European Union nor the United Kingdom will be a priority for the president of the United States. In reality, the emphasis of the next two years may be summed up by the adage, "after the election is before the election."

God bless America, as well as us! Without or with a free trade agreement.

The U.S. Census Bureau mandates exporters to provide Electronic Export Information (EEI) on shipments to the majority of overseas destinations with a value of \$2,500 or more, per Schedule B code. The Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) site, which is managed by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, is where exporters must submit this information (CBP).

U.S. Export Controls

Export violations of U.S. telecommunications equipment

BIS last week issued an Administrative Charging Letter against Mohammad Alhamra and WEBS Electronics Trading Company LLC (WEBS). The Charging Letter alleges export violations of U.S. telecommunications equipment and related commodities to Syria and Iran, as well as misrepresentations and concealment of facts to BIS officials. Export controls on Syria and Iran are among the strictest because their governments support terrorism, abuse human rights, and destabilise regional security. According to the Charging Letter, OEE launched an investigation after a BIS Export Control Officer (ECO) learned that WEBS and its owner, Mohammad Alhamra, were reexporting U.S.-origin items from the UAE to Syria and conducted end-use checks. Routers, gateways, serial device servers, networkable door controllers, server racks, interface cards, and IP phones are included. Alhamra and WEBS reexported items from the UAE to Syria and Iran 11 times without the required BIS licences. Alhamra misled the ECO about reexports to Syria. The Charging Letter lists 14 Alhamra and WEBS violations. Administrative monetary penalties can reach \$330,947 per violation or twice the transaction value under the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4801-4852). Here's the full Charging Letter.

The Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) is issuing Russia-related General License 53 "Authorizing Transactions for Diplomatic Missions of the Russian Federation Prohibited by Directive 4 under Executive Order 14024", + one Russia-related Frequently Asked Question (1096). The Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) is issuing Russia-related General License 8D, "Authorizing Transactions Related to Energy." Link

South Africans get listed on the SDN

Individuals from South Africa have been added to OFAC's SDN List. Some are linked to the Islamic State of Iraq / Levant Islamic State of Iraq and Syria / Arabic acronym Daesh. The South African

Securities and Exchange Commission (Safar) has published the details of companies that may be subject to sanctions and they have been added to the US list, too. Link

Tornado Cash virtual currency mixing launders \$96 million and ends up on the SDN

OFAC took Tornado Cash off the SDN list and put it back on because it helped DPRK WMD activities. In short, Tornado Cash mixes different virtual currencies by using smart contracts on Ethereum. Smart contracts are a type of computer code that Tornado Cash uses to set up its governance structure, offer mixing services, give users financial incentives, and grow its user base. Smart contracts have been used to hide where funds from cyber heists, like the Lazarus Group funds stolen in March 2022, came from. Using Tornado Cash smart contracts, cybercriminals cleaned \$96 million from the Harmony Bridge Heist on June 24, 2022, and \$7.8 million from the Nomad Heist on August 2, 2022.

Lazarus Group, which is involved with the DPRK hid where the money from a cyber heist came from by using Tornado Cash smart contracts. Under E.O. 13722, OFAC is punishing Tornado Cash for helping, sponsoring, or giving financial, material, or technological support to the DPRK Government, a person whose property and property interests are blocked by E.O. 13722. OFAC is also reclassifying Tornado Cash under E.O. 13694, as amended because it has helped, sponsored, or given financial, material, or technological support to a cyber-enabled activity that started or was led, in whole or in large part, by people outside the U.S. and that is likely to pose a significant threat to national security or has materially contributed to it.

As a result of these actions, all property and interests in property of the individuals and entity designated must be blocked and reported to OFAC. OFAC's regulations prohibit all U.S. dealings (including transiting transactions) involving blocked or designated persons' property or interests in property. Don't forget that persons who transact with those designated may also be designated. Any foreign financial institution that knowingly facilitates a significant transaction or provides significant financial services for anyone on the list could face U.S. correspondent or payable-through account sanctions.

OFAC's power and integrity come from its ability to add and remove people from the Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons (SDN) List. Sanctions aim to change behaviour, not punish. FAQ 897 explains how to be removed from an OFAC list, including the SDN List. OFAC's website explains how to request removal from a sanctions list. OFAC's FAQs 1076–1079 and FAQ 1095 provide more information about Tornado Cash sanctions. Link

EU Export Controls

Update of the Annexes of the EU Dual-Use Regulation

With the Delegated Regulation of October 21, 2022, the EU Commission initiated the update of Annex I of Regulation (EU) No. 2021/821 (EU Dual Use Regulation). This Delegated Regulation is expected to come into force at the beginning of January 2023. Goods that are covered by Annex I of

Regulation (EU) 2021/821 ("EU Dual-Use Regulation") in the current version require a permit. In addition, export restrictions may arise

- the Anti-Torture regulations
- Embargo regulations (e.g. Iran, North Korea or Russia)
- the firearms laws (national)
- the use (e.g. in connection with conventional weapons or weapons of mass destruction)

Sanctions

Sanctions against Myanmar/Burma extended

The European Council decided to amend Regulation (EU) No 401/2013 on Myanmar/Burma sanctions. The Union opposes torture, sexual and gender-based abuse, and the persecution of civil society and human rights advocates. A few of the tnewlynew sanctioned entities are:

- The entire State Administration Council (SAC) is now listed. It was formed on 2 February 2021 after a military coup in Myanmar/Burma.
- Kan Zaw (a.k.a. Dr Kan Zaw) is the Minister for Investment and Foreign Economic Relations. He is part of the military government that toppled lawfully elected authorities in Myanmar/Burma.
- Swe Sew Aung is the Prosecution Department's, Director General. The Prosecution Department, under Swe Sew Aung's leadership, has been involved in several judicial cases against democratically elected leaders and opposition figures that were conducted in violation of the right to defence and the right to a fair trial, including the proceedings leading to the execution of four pro-democracy figures. Therefore, in her capacity as Director-General of the Prosecution Department, Swe Swe Aung is engaged in activities that undermine democracy and the rule of law in Myanmar/Burma.
- Myanmar/Burma prisons are managed by Zaw Min. His jails have been violent, brutal, and inhumane to prisoners.

- Under U Than Swe's leadership, the Anti-Corruption Commission legitimised the coup. Its participation in cases against democratically elected leaders, like Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, undermines democracy and the rule of law.
- Lt. Gen. Phone Myat is the commander of BSO 3 of the Tatmadaw since April 2021. Under his direction, military troops perpetrated human rights abuses, crimes, and atrocities, including executions, ground and air strikes on people, and massacres.
- Thet Pon commands BSO 5 of the Myanmar Armed Forces (Tatmadaw). As BSO 5 Commander, he oversees the military and military tribunals in Yangon.
- General Than Htike is responsible for human rights atrocities, undermining democracy and the rule of law in Myanmar/Burma.
- Major General Nyunt Win Swe is the Yangon Region Commander of the Tatmadaw since 2020.
- Nyunt Win Swe is responsible for human rights crimes and actions undermining Myanmar's democracy and rule of law. His Htoo Group of Companies is linked to the Tatmadaw leadership.
- Naing Htut Aung is an importer and dealer for the Myanmar military.

Sanctions against Mail amended

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) Committee, which was set up by UNSC Resolution 2374 (2017), updated the information about three people who were subject to restrictive measures on October 5, 2022. So, Annex I of Regulation (EU) 2017/1770 should be changed to reflect this.

- <u>Council Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2179 of 8 November 2022 implementing</u> Regulation (EU) 2017/1770 concerning restrictive measures given the situation in Mali
- Council Implementing Decision (CFSP) 2022/2187 of 8 November 2022 implementing Decision (CFSP) 2017/1775 concerning restrictive measures given the situation in Mali

Sanctions against North Korea amended

The UNSC Committee, which was set up by UNSC Resolution 1718 (2006), updated the information about two entities that are subject to restrictive measures. This Regulation (EU) 2017/1509 should be changed to reflect this, and it will become law on September 14, 2022. Singwang Economics and Trading General Corporation is a DPRK firm for trading coal. DPRK generates a significant share of the money for its nuclear and ballistic missile programmes by mining natural resources and selling those resources abroad. Weihai World-Shipping Freight, 419-201, Tongyi Lu, Huancui Qu, Weihai, Shandong 264200, China; IMO number: 5905801- Ship and commercial manager of the XIN GUANG HAI, a vessel that on loaded coal at Taean, DPRK, on 27 October 2017 and had an ETA of 14 November 2017 to Cam Pha, Vietnam, but it did not arrive.'

Sanctions against Turkey prolonged

The EU has decided that sanctions against Turkey's unauthorised drilling in the Eastern Mediterranean should continue until November 12, 2023.

Sanctions against Venezuela prolonged

In light of Venezuela's ongoing political, economic, social, and humanitarian crisis, the European Council has extended the restrictive measures. The restrictive measures against all persons in the list set out in the regulation should be maintained, and the statement of reasons for 17 persons should be updated.

Some of the entries and their reasons for inclusion:

- Omar José Prieto Fernández actively promoted the non-democratic National Assembly elections on December 6, 2020.
- In her capacity as a Supreme Court justice, Lourdes Benicia SUREZ ANDERSON has undermined democracy and the rule of law.
- Indira Maira Alfonzo Izaguirre has been held accountable for actions that have usurped the National Assembly's constitutional powers and undermined the opposition's electoral rights. She has supported and facilitated the executive branch's undermining of democracy and the rule of law. She is responsible for the actions taken against the then-newly elected National Assembly in December 2015 as a member of the Supreme Court's Electoral Chamber.
- Tania d'Amelio Cardiet contributed directly to the undermining of democracy and the rule of law in Venezuela, including by preparing the non-democratic 2020 National Assembly elections, as Vice-President of the CNE and President of the Political Participation and Financing Commission on 7 August 2020 by the Supreme Court (Tribunal Supremo de Justicia (TSJ).
- <u>Council Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2194 of 10 November 2022 implementing</u> Regulation (EU) 2017/2063 concerning restrictive measures given the situation in Venezuela
- <u>Council Decision (CFSP) 2022/2201 of 10 November 2022 amending Decision</u> (CFSP) 2017/2074 concerning restrictive measures given the situation in Venezuela

Bird Flu: Protection zones in the concerned EU Member States revised

Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) is an infectious viral disease in birds and may have a severe impact on the profitability of poultry farming. HPAI viruses can infect migratory birds, which can then spread these viruses over long distances during their autumn and spring migrations. Further outbreaks of HPAI in poultry or captive birds in Belgium, Germany, France, Italy and the Netherlands have been reported to the European Commission. The Commission has examined the situation in Belgium where an outbreak was confirmed near the border with the Netherlands. Belgium, Bulgaria, Germany, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Belgium and the Netherlands are working together to rapidly describe protection and surveillance zones for HPAI to avoid unjustified barriers to trade being imposed by third countries. The Annex to implementing Decision (EU) 2021/641 has been amended to update regionalisation at the Union level. Link

If you are involved in import or export, you may have heard that the CHIEF customs system has been replaced by the CDS system.

In what ways will this affect you and your company?

Customs Declaration Service is intended to be abbreviated as "CDS." This is the brand-new customs declaration platform, and according to HMRC, it is unified, current, and agile. It went into effect across the United Kingdom in October 2022.

Using CDS, businesses can submit declarations for both imports and exports. The CHIEF system is now obsolete and cannot be employed.

This change from CDS to CHIEF is the most significant modification to customs operations and procedures in over three decades! It affects everyone required to submit a customs declaration in the United Kingdom, including customs agents, freight forwarders, fast parcel operators, and self-filing businesses.

Tell me then, what is it like to utilise CDS?

It is possible to compare filing a customs declaration to filing a tax return; however, rather than doing it once a year, you must fill out the majority of the 91 CDS data elements every time you import or export goods, which can be a logistical hassle.

What is the difficulty with CDS?

The fact that the data requirements vary based on the type of declaration you intend to file and what you intend to do with the goods after they enter or leave the United Kingdom presents a challenge. The difficulty arises from the fact that certain data elements are required while others are optional. To make matters worse, the requirements for some data elements change midway through the completion of the CDS document.

A difficult start

The transition to CDS has not been devoid of difficulties. Businesses have indicated that they are having trouble adjusting to the new system; as a result, some of them have been forced to delay the implementation of the new system by one month to iron out the kinks.

Despite everything, it's a remarkable accomplishment

Since October 2022, however, thousands of businesses have successfully transitioned to CDS and have been able to keep Brian's goods moving in and out of the country despite CDS' initial problems. To modify this system, businesses were required to make substantial financial and time commitments. Ultimately, the HMRC joined forces with other software companies, businesses, and training providers to implement this change. We are well prepared for whatever the future may bring because we now have such an advanced customs declaration system. With a modern custom filing system, CDS, British businesses can now grow into global enterprises and sell their products in every country.

Consolidates list of CDS changes

- The goods covered by Additional Procedure Code 63T in Data Element (DE) 1/11 for Customs Clearance Requests (CCR) C21i have been extended to include Postal Transit – under UPU (Universal Postal Union) convention.
- Data Element 2/3 (Appendix 5A): Completion instructions for document codes N002 and N851 have been amended to reflect the differences depending on whether the prenotification was done using PEACH or IPAFFS. The document status codes for these document codes have also been updated. Document code Y946 has also been amended to show that it can be used on both import and export declarations. Document code 9UKR has been removed, as it is no longer in use.
- If you submitted a declaration using the Customs Declaration Service and need to send supporting documents or respond to HMRC queries, you can send HMRC more than 10 documents but these must be split up and submitted in groups of no more than 10.

- The goods location code for Peterhead has been amended.
- A facility for Portrack Seafreight Ltd has been re-listed in its capacity as a wharf.

Changes to Import of Products, Animals, Food and Feed Service (IPAFFS)

There will be times when it will be necessary to inform or alert businesses of important events or occurrences. The new service messaging feature will be a method of achieving this. The new service messaging boxes will appear at the top of the dashboard. The boxes will either have a blue outline titled "Information" or a yellow outline titled "Alert". The change will take effect on the 10th of November 2022.

Each change will have its own affected scope.

There are four changes:

- Change 1: Service Messaging
- Change 2: Rewording of "certificate" to "notification".
- Change 3: Searching functionality on dashboards for commodity and the microchip number.
- Change 4: Message for cats, dogs and ferrets arriving from Poland and Romania.

You may see changes in the dashboard(s) and other areas of IPAFFS. You may also wish to make use of the new searching functionality. Information on each of the changes will be detailed later.

UK VAT

Late VAT submission, payment, and interest charges

HMRC will change penalties for late VAT returns and payments on 1 January 2023 and replaces the default surcharge with separate late VAT return and payment penalties in 2023. The new pointsbased system for late submissions should be tolerant of occasional slip-ups while penalising repeat offenders. Late submissions (including null or repayment returns) could cost £200 and penalty points. Payback interest will replace HMRC's repayment supplement. Customers who request a repayment will receive interest from the due date or submission date (whichever is later) until the payback is made.

Open general export licences (OGELs)

Use an OGEL to export controlled dual-use or military goods, software and technology overseas. General trade licence Russia sanctions – financial services and funds related to fertilisers have been added to the collection. Link

UK Sanctions

The Russia (Sanctions) (EU Exit) (Amendment) (No. 16) Regulations 2022

The new amendment moves the date for the prohibition of all trade in oil and oil products from December 31, 2022, to December 5, 2022. It contains new rules regarding the sale and shipment of oil and oil products by ship. It is also illegal to provide related or auxiliary services, subject to some exceptions. There are Treasury licences that allow oil and oil products to be shipped by sea despite the new rules. No trade licences will be issued for the new restrictions. Companies will have to provide the Treasury with specific information about the new rules. The Customs and Excise Management Act of 1979 can be used to investigate and prosecute violations of Regulation 67 of the 2019 Regulations involving the new bans. The amendment specifies where crimes related to the new rules occur, there can be a prosecution. Link to Law

44 entries amended on the UK Consolidated list

44 entries have been amended under the <u>Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Global Human</u> <u>Rights, Myanmar</u> and <u>Russia</u> financial sanctions regimes. On 11 November 2022 the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office updated the <u>UK Sanctions List</u> on <u>GOV.UK</u>. This list provides details of those designated under regulations made under the Sanctions Act. 1 entry has been amended under the DPRK regime; 4 entries have been amended and 2 entries corrected under the Global Human Rights regime; 36 entries have been amended under the Myanmar regime, and 1 entry has been amended under the Russian regime. These entries remain subject to an asset freeze.

The relevant notices can be found on the respective regime pages.

OFSI's consolidated list of asset freeze targets has been updated to reflect these changes.

Wood you know the difference? The CITES timber identification repository goes live!

CITES governs many timber trades. Thousands of cargoes are always in transit, and if they include CITES-listed species, they require export and import licences. When they reach a border, a customs official must identify the species being carried to ensure it's legal. There are similar-looking species, one of which is endangered and requires permission while the other isn't. The CITES Secretariat has always helped authorities with species identification, and the newest tool is the web-based CITES Repository on Timber Identification. The repository currently contains close to 100 materials important to identifying CITES-listed tree species. As Parties utilise it, their input and experiences will polish and improve it. The repository also helps find CITES-approved forensic labs for identifying tree species. Here
